From the Desk of Fr. Francis


Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

Pray to the Holy Family to help you. Ask God for all the graces and help you need to be a good family. God will be with you and present in your family just as God was with Mary and Joseph as they raised Jesus, God's Son. God will always give yon what your need. Love one another.
