## Respect Life

**Why Rejecting Socialism? (I of II)** – We Catholics believe in free will, in personal responsibility, in divine laws and in love – love of our creator and our fellow human beings; and we'll do our very best to handle our present life so as to prepare ourselves to enter our afterlife eternal home. In society, we favor to uphold true liberty that is the freedom to decide all matters that lie within our own competence and to follow the course shown by our reason, within the laws of morality, including the dictates of justice and charity. In contrast, *Socialism seeks to eliminate "injustice" by transferring rights and responsibilities from individuals and families to the State. In the process of eliminating "injustice", it actually creates injustice and destroys true liberty.* This result has been well demonstrated in *Communism – an extreme form of Socialism.* Under this kind of ideology, a state easily gravitates to rule by dictatorship and literally treats its people like a herd of cattle. In the following, we can cite objections to socialism in more details. **1. Socialism violates human nature. It destroys personal initiative** – a fruit of our intellect and free will – *and replaces it with State control.* It tends to totalitarianism, with its government and police repression, wherever it is implemented. **2. Socialism violates private property.** It calls for "redistributing the wealth" by taking from the *rich* to give to the *poor*. It imposes taxes that punish those who have been able to take greater advantage of their productive talents, capacity to work or thrift. It uses taxation to promote economic and social egalitarianism, a goal that will be fully achieved, according to The Communist Manifesto, with the "abolition of private property." **3. Socialism opposes traditional marriage.** It sees no moral reason for people to restrict sex to marriage, that is, to an indissoluble union between a man and a woman. It undermines private property, which Friedrich Engels, founder of modern socialism and communism along with Karl Marx, saw as the foundation of traditional marriage. **4. Socialism opposes parental rights in education.** Almost from birth, children are to be handed over to public institutions, where they will be taught what the State wants, regardless of parental views. Evolution must be taught. School prayer must be forbidden. **5. Socialism promotes radical equality. A supposed absolute equality among human beings is the fundamental assumption of socialism.** It sees any inequality as unjust in itself. Private employers are quickly portrayed as "exploiters" whose profits really belong to their employees. As a consequence, they rule out the system of wage earning. (To be continued.)

## Faith Witness #4: Special Times Together, Part II by Thomas Howard

Last week readers were left with the image of a couple sitting on a shaded bench at the far northern end of Ping Tom Park, with one head gently resting on another's shoulder. This first part described what was going on in my spouse's mind as we celebrated our thirty-third wedding anniversary. Libia's contemplations were practical, zeroing in on the essence of Christian marriage. She was reminded of St. Paul's frame for love, *patient, and kind, not jealous or inflated*.

Some of you may know Ping Tom Park. The Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal parallel the eastern boundary of the park. This man-made waterway not only provides a dock for thousands of tourists getting off the Chicago Water taxi and tour boats every day in order to make their way to one of Chinatown's famous restaurants, but it also provides a magnificent public platform to celebrate Chinese cultural heritage. Dragon boat races and ethnic festivals in the summer along with Tai Chi during on weekday mornings help keep this city park busy throughout the year.

I have always associated my identity with that of someone on the move. And yet these past few months have been unlike anything I have or many in our world have ever experienced. A global pandemic, socio-economic uncertainty, cultural upheaval, and political and civil unrest: each of these has shifted the paradigm in terms of how my identity now gets shaped and formed.

Instead of playing the role of a capitalist, on a constant search for increasing access to opportunity, I now found myself in an in-between place. I don't believe God wanted me to stifle creativity, but perhaps just pause for a moment in history, in order to savor graced moments from our marriage like this one. What follows describes what was going on in my consciousness at that moment:



*"Honey, I just counted fourteen different ways human beings can travel in and around this small park: Light rail, CTA, Amtrak, kayaks, bicycles, and the Chicago Water Taxi to just name a few. The world is still active and on the move, albeit at a much slower pace. Perhaps, like Israel in the desert, we are being challenged to live with hopeful expectations. The gap between promise and fulfillment is extending way*

*beyond Lent this year! Nothing ordinary about these times of ours!*

Having described the two different states of consciousness on that park bench that July afternoon, this two-week faith testimony now concludes with this observation. While a snapshot of Christian marriage on a park bench may portray a romantic love pose, a couple can definitely benefit by zooming in and taking time to describe what is truly going on behind the scene. Alpha's marriage course provides a platform for this to happen. When a couple attends its marriage, fostering reciprocal love, two distinct horizons, like my spouse' practical priorities and my logical priorities, are able to fuse together into an organic whole.

### Thirsty and Hungry by Sr. Caritas

These last few weeks we have had many 90 degree days. No doubt you found yourself thirsty at various times during the heat. When I was in the Sonora Desert near Tucson, Arizona, it could get above 100 degrees. Thirst is frequent in the desert. I found that water was the best when you were thirsty. The second-best thing was lemonade. Pop did not work. It made the thirst worse.

The first reading today is about being thirsty. There are many ways of being thirsty besides wanting something to drink. There is a thirst for knowledge, a thirst for adventure, and there is the hunger and thirst for God. We seek many things. Deep inside of us we all have a longing for God though we may not recognize the fact. When we come to know God, to know Jesus, nothing is ever the same. Sometimes we try to satisfy this thirst for God with other things. Nothing really can satisfy the thirst for God, except God.

The first reading has God calling us to come and drink of the water even when we do not have money to buy it. He calls us to come to Him, God, and we will find our thirst satisfied. In the Gospel, Jesus recognized that the people will be hungry in the far away place where they were. He challenges the apostles to feed them. They have five loaves and two fish. Jesus multiplies what they had and with this He feeds 5000 men, women and children. We see the great love of Jesus for us. He will satisfy our thirst, He will feed our hunger. The challenge is to recognize our thirst and hunger for God. We need to open ourselves so God can satisfy us, nurture and nourish us. Being with Jesus, close to God, will give us all that we long for, all that we hunger and thirst for.
