Mission and Personal Conversion

St. Mother Teresa believes that we shouldn't impose our faith to others, for faith is a gift from God, but personal conversion is necessary for one to be closer to God. Personal conversion also helps us to be closer to each other, which ultimately creates a better world for all to live in.

Biblically speaking, when God chooses a person for a major task, that person usually undergoes a profound encounter with God, a transformation of heart and mind. For example, immediately before St. Paul was sent as one of Jesus' apostles, on the road to Damascus, Saul was knocked on the ground. That experience changed him from persecuting Christians to a passionate follower of Jesus. His name was changed and he went on many missions to preach about Jesus Christ; many came to believe in Jesus; and eventually he gave his life to Jesus.

We all are called to be missionary disciples and to bear good fruits in our lives. The Gospel stories in the last few Sundays have challenged us to be good workers in God's vineyard. We are not the owner, but stewards and servants of God. We have responsibilities to save our own souls as well as others, not by imposition, but by our transformed ways of words and deeds. When we have a personal encounter with Jesus, we are changed to be true witness of the Gospel.

What helps us to encounter God? What helps us to be transformed? How can we help each other to grow in our faith and in our love for Jesus and for God's people?

Faith Witness #10: Betty Fung's Faith Story

My name is Betty Fung and today I would like to share with all of you what brought me to my Catholic faith. It started four years ago in April 2015, when I was diagnosed with kidney failure and I found out that I needed dialysis in order to survive. I was devastated and thought to myself, "why me?" What have I done to deserve this? Every time the doctors came to see me and told me they needed to run more tests, I prayed. When I was released from the hospital and recovering at home, my husband asked me if I was interested in attending RCIA class to learn more about the Catholic faith. I wasn't planning on it at first, but he said to attend a few of the classes and decide if I wanted to continue or not. After going to a few of the classes, with the inspiration from my teacher Rose, I stayed. From that point, I knew God would always be there for me. After getting baptized in April 2019, a miracle happened to me. I received a call for a kidney from a deceased donor. Although, the kidney was high risk, I did not want to take that chance, so I waited. Because of that miracle, it brought my family and I closer together. We would always pray at night together as a family and thank God for the suffering he has gone through for us. By August 2019, I received a call for a kidney that was from a living donor and it was a perfect match for me. On November 1, 2019, I got my kidney transplant and I am so thankful that I put my faith in the hands of God by attending RCIA and because of my husband persuading me to go. Today, God is the most important part of my life because he has been there for me through this whole journey. He has helped me, my family and others by being so merciful and grateful. God is so important to me because he is always answering my prayers, listening to me, and guiding me through the tough times. I would like to thank all the people that has prayed for me, my family and God, I wouldn't have been able to have a second chance at life if it wasn't for all of you.



RESPECT LIFE CORNER

Justice Comes to All – When people of fame pass away, tributes usually are poured in praising them who made so many important contributions that will affect many for years to come. Some admire their tenacity, talents and abilities, and some celebrate their exceptional character, professional decisions and achievements. While these things might be important or inspirational for many, they matter little to the persons just departed. We hope that they all said “yes” to a final saving grace before death. Nevertheless, we know that, after death, all souls stand alone before the Divine Judge, who exercises a justice far more supreme than any earthly tribunal. In spite of what is said and done in this world, they will be judged by their past acts, their adherence to God’s law and their love for Him. The God’s eternal law, summarized in the Ten Commandments and written by God on the hearts of all, will be the standard of His justice. All our sins and the consequences of our iniquities are finally revealed. We who exercised authority or leadership on earth will be held accountable for all whose lives and acts depended upon us, rich or poor, old or young, born or unborn. We who exercised justice on earth will be asked if we defended the higher law written on our hearts, and we will have to render accounts for every bad decision we handed down. After death, there is no more time to seek forgiveness or make amends for the evil we have done. We will see what folly it is not to prepare for the moment of judgment or just to think that we will not be judged for our sins. Nothing can be added to improve this standing of ours before God. The Divine judgment is infallible. His Mercy is not forgotten — those consigned to Hell for eternity or to Purgatory for a time are punished less than their sins would deserve. The most important moment of our lives is the hour of our death. All other considerations are as nothing when this moment arrives. And the demise of important public figures should remind us of the futility of seeking after the praise of our sinful world, and that indeed, without exception, justice comes to all — O Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death! Come to the Feast by Sr. Caritas

In our lives we have special events, special celebrations where we share special meals. Some of these celebrations have unrestricted invitations for people to come. At other times we have smaller more specific celebrations with very limited invitations to the dinners. Both events are celebrations many times limited and determined by particular events such as birthdays or anniversaries.

As we listen to the first reading today, we are aware of the lavishness of the event taking place “on the Lord’s mountain.” Many of the things that could limit or destroy the celebration on the “Lord’s mountain” we are told God will destroy. This enables all who participate, to celebrate with unlimited joy. “Let us be glad and rejoice for the Lord has saved us.” The parable Jesus tells, describes the wedding feast prepared by the king for his son and the guests. Many people refused to attend even though they had accepted the invitation. The king destroys these invited guests. The king invites people from the near and far streets. All are welcome. Everyone who came to the feast was also given a wedding garment. One guest did not have the garment on. The king noticed and threw him out. Then the feast began.

Through baptism, we have all been invited and have participated in the celebration of the Son, at Mass. We have all been given and have the garment of grace, purchased at a great price, the Blood of Jesus. We are saved and invited to attend the banquet in the kingdom of God. All can have the “wedding garment” of grace but we must say yes. We are called to live the virtues and gifts and graces which enable us to fully wear the “wedding garment” of God’s life. How we live our lives, determines the wedding garment. Come to celebrate in the kingdom of God. All are invited. *Will you find an excuse for not participating or will you say yes to God, each day?*
