Mission and the World

Today we celebrate the annual World Mission Sunday for the missions and the missionaries around the World. What a wonderful opportunity for us all as Christians to not only pray for God's blessings upon all missionaries and of our works as disciples, but to reflect on our call as missionary disciples: how do we take seriously our responsibilities for our own salvation? What are our obligations toward our parish? And how do we be responsible and fruitful stewards in our world?

Vatican II's *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World* states, "Throughout the course of the centuries, men have labored to better the circumstances of their lives through a monumental amount of individual and collective effort. To believers, this point is settled: considered in itself, this human activity accords with God's will. For man, created to God's image, received a mandate to subject to himself the earth and all it contains, and to govern the world with justice and holiness;(1) a mandate to relate himself and the totality of things to Him Who was to be acknowledged as the Lord and Creator of all. Thus, by the subjection of all things to man, the name of God would be wonderful in all the earth. (2)" Clearly created in God's image, we all are called to do God's will and to care for our world with justice and holiness.

Pope Francis in his recent encyclical titled "*Brothers All (Fratelli Tutti)*" challenges all human beings to excise fraternity and social friendship, and to reconcile with one another as brothers and sisters. He opens up his letter by identifying the common issues that our human family faces now. The culture of death and waste must be replaced with "dialogue, respect, generosity toward every human being." The Pope offers us much to pray and reflect and act upon in this encyclical. The First Millennial Saint hard at work at St. Therese Chinese Catholic School

“Mr. Howard, can we talk about Carlos Acutis some more?” This question, posed by an at-home, non-Catholic St. Therese Chinese Catholic School student, an individual who rarely participates in class and goes to mass infrequently, only when he is at school, intrigued me. “Tell me more, young man. It was just yesterday that we celebrated an online mass together. first hearing about the beatification of Carlos Acutis in Fr. Li’s homily.

“Guess what! Carlos came to me in a dream last night. It was amazing. Carlos told me to believe in myself and never give up. He went to mass every day. He is in heaven now. I believe him,” this 4th-grade student enthusiastically replied.

Next, the class grew even more animated. “Mr. Howard, I too, met Carlos last night in a dream. He told me to pray. Then he suggested I start taking pictures of Catholic Churches.”

The dynamic action of the Holy Spirit struck me in both of these diverse dream experiences. The call to self-discipline seemed to be the challenge Carlos presented the first witness. Carlos was known for not wasting time. Like Carlos, this 4th grader loves to play video games for many hours. The way Carlos set limits for himself with video games caught this student’s attention. “Pleasing God should be our goal,” Carlos always reminded himself.

The second witness, on the other hand, came from a baptized Catholic, someone blessed with sacramental character. Here, like in the case of Carlos with his website on Eucharistic miracles, Jesus seems to be calling upon the special gifts found in young people today to build the kingdom of God. Carlos now serves as God’s messenger, especially with young Catholics searching for their unique niche in ministry.

The class finished with a review of Carlos’s website. “Did Carlos write every single word on his web site? If he did, he certainly did not waste much of his time,” commented the first witness.

Heading upstairs to prepare for my next class, this holy moment was cherished. It was a privilege to witness the saving action of our Lord Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church’s 1st Millennial saint. Thank you Carlos Acutis for touching the lives of our students in such a profound way.

Belonging to God by Sr. Caritas

Many of the days in the last few weeks, we have been blest with beautiful sunshine filled days and warm temperatures. Sometimes we have a breeze or wind blowing. As I look around these mornings, I see the beauty of God as the leaves begin to change and the transition to late fall and winter start coming our way. Being around young children or having the privilege of holding a newborn baby also always makes me think of the beauty and power of God. An infant is so perfectly formed. These are both gifts from God and ways of God being present in our lives. We also have all the gifts of God's grace, the gift of the sacraments, the Word of God, and salvation through the death and resurrection of Jesus, the best gift to us, His son. We can see, smell, feel, speak, think, love and do many other things. These are all gifts of God in our lives. We, who are made in the image and likeness of God, are gifts of God.

Our first reading today speaks of how God acted to help and protect His people, Israel, by defeating their enemies and winning their battles. Even though they did not "know" God or recognize His gifts or action on their behalf, God still proclaimed He makes the sun rise and set. He uses His power to protect His people so that "people may know that there is no God besides me. I am the Lord there is no other." Jesus responds to the trickery of the Pharisees in today's Gospel. To their question Jesus answers, "Give to Caesar the things belonging to Caesar and give to God the things that belong to God."

We are called to live this statement. Through Baptism and creation, we belong to God. We give ourselves to God through worship, adoration, and prayer. We give ourselves to God through obedience and belief in and to the Word of God, and His teachings and commandments. We give ourselves to God by doing His will and following Jesus. Our friends, family and companions in life, are gifts of God to us. They belong to God. He shares them with us. How do we "give them to God." I would guess it is how we reverence them and care for them. When we truly love them, we are doing what God would have us do. All creation is God's. How do we give it to God? When we respect creation, when we do not destroy creation, contaminate water and air and creation, we are reverencing it and "giving it to God." What will you "Give to God?" How will each of us live out these words of Jesus?
