

Faith Witness #12: Faith Story by Chris Lee



God is love, and love perfected.



The Bible tells us that, and the Church teaches it. At certain moments in our lives, we have the privilege of witnessing a glimpse of that divine love lived out by other people. Last week, my grandpa died. He was 89. Since he was 21, he had been married to my grandma. This December, they would have celebrated their 68th wedding anniversary. In their nearly seven decades together, they shared many blessings and challenges. In the picture, my grandma is praying the rosary while holding my grandpa's hands on the day he died. Those are the hands that held each other as wedding bells rang in 1952. Those are the hands that raised four children. Those are the hands that worked in the community health clinic and ran a construction company. And those are the hands that welcomed grandchildren and great grandchildren into a growing family. Those are also the hands that buried a son. And those are the hands that have recently confronted increasingly serious health challenges. But throughout, those are the hands that have exemplified God's love to me. My grandparents' love for each other was patient and kind; it was not jealous or boastful; it was not arrogant or rude. It did not insist on its own way; it was not resentful; it did not rejoice at wrong, but rejoiced in the right. Their love bore all things, believed all things, hoped all things, and endured all things. As Corinthians tells us, as for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away; but love never ends.

We'll miss you, Papa. But thank you for showing us what it means to love, and for providing a witness through your life that has inspired me to reach for God's love in mine.

This month of October has many special saints in it. St. Luke's feast is coming. St. Margaret Mary's feast was last Sunday. Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary (The Sister in the front left Church window) at St. Therese. Jesus asked for First Friday and reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We also have Saint Pope John Paull II, St Francis of Assisi, St. Teresa of Avila and St. Therese. All saints are holy. All are known for their great imitation of Jesu and are people of great love. We are called to be holy, to be like the saints, like Jesus. Saints come from all countries, some are grandmothers and mothers and fathers. Some are children. Sometimes, when we are thinking about what it means to be holy, we feel like we don't know. It is simple. It is to love. It is doing God's will with love.

Saints are people who have deep faith in God. Martyr saints give their lives because of their belief in God. Other saints live lives of trust knowing, no matter what, God will take care of them. Some, like St Isaac Jogues, a Jesuit of North America, died witnessing because of fidelity to God. Living out love in our everyday lives is what we are all called to do. St. Peter and the apostles left everything and followed Jesus. Missionary Saints left everything, going to other countries to teach the message of Jesus and His life. Popes, kings, queens, beggars and very ordinary people also become saints.

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells the Pharisees and teachers of the law, how to live love, how to be holy. "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, all your soul and with all your mind. The second is like it. You shall love your neighbor as yourself." We will not usually be people who do great important things. We are people, no matter our age or what role we have in life, who can do everything with great love. We can act lovingly to our neighbor. We can live out what love really is. Love Gives Everything. Love gives every day, in every way. All the time.
